## BOYLE Unreached People of Indonesia Baptist Mid-Missions



Both Justin and Cassandra had the privilege of being raised in a Christian family. Justin professed faith in Christ at the age of 12 and Cassandra at 14. They met each other at Crown College of the Bible and were married shortly after graduating. They then moved to the Island of Kauai where they ministered among many different people groups for six years. During this time of ministry the Lord directed their hearts toward serving as missionaries and gave them four beautiful children. The Lord also placed on their hearts the unreached people of Indonesia. They moved back to South Carolina to gain more ministry experience. The Boyle's have partnered with Baptist Mid Missions. With Kingsway Baptist as their sending church, they have started their deputation journey to raise the prayer and financial support needed to take the gospel to the unreached people of Indonesia. They have a desired departure time of early 2023 to work with BMM partners already laboring in Indonesia.

Keith: Having grown up in a Christian home, I am thankful that we always went to church and that I could learn the stories of the Bible and Christian principles. At the same time, I was trying to be good and do the right things so that my parents would be proud of me. When we moved to Birmingham, I heard our new pastor speak of a personal relationship with Jesus and things made more sense to me. At age 16, I gave my heart to Jesus, and about two years later I believed that the Lord wanted me to be a missionary. I prepared for the ministry at Liberty University, where I met Dawn Smith, and we married after graduation.

Dawn: I'm so grateful to the Lord for Christian parents who loved me and took me to churches with good doctrine in the cities where we lived. When I was seven years old, my mother took my sisters and me to a Child Evangelism Good News Club where I understood for the first time that I was a sinner and that Jesus had died on the cross for my sin. That's when I asked Him to forgive me and to come into my heart and be my Savior.

Together we were church planters for 32 years with TEAM (The Evangelical Alliance Mission). We served in Bogota, Colombia, for nine years to plant a new church. After that, we planted a church in Tegucigalpa. Honduras, for the professional class. After 16 years, we asked the church in Honduras to send us to Charlotte to begin a church for those whose heart language is Spanish. Today we are striving to share the gospel each week and see a church formed that will train others and be a sending church.

#### WOLSIEFFER Church Planters Round Rock, TX
