Finding Rest
Hebrews 4:1–13



1. Divine rest is available. (1–10)

The exhortation to fear. (1)
See Isaiah 8:11–13.

Negative example: Israel failed to enter rest. (2–3, 5–9)

Positive example: God the Father rested. (4, 10)

2. Divine rest is urgent. (11–13)

The exhortation to be diligent. (11)
See Hebrews 2:1.

Why? Because the Word of God is discerning. (12–13)

Application:

Divine rest in the “already, but not yet...”

- Past: Have you experienced the rest that a relationship with Christ provides?
- Present: Are you currently resting in the rest that a relationship with Christ provides?
- Future: Are you rejoicing in the rest that is to come?
